COURSE SPECIFIC ADDITIONAL LOCAL RULES

OUT OF BOUNDS

- Where white stakes are immediately adjacent to a public path or road, the boundary is defined as the course side, stakes are indicative only.
- A ball that is played from one side of a road which is defined as Out of Bounds and comes to rest on the other side of that road is Out of Bounds. This is true even if the ball comes to rest on another part of the course that is in bounds for other holes.
- The Maintenance Area between Holes 1, 10 and 11.

PENALTY AREAS

- 7th Hole Where a ball enters the red penalty area, players have the option of (for one stroke penalty):
 - o Teeing up a second ball in the original teeing area;
 - o Dropping a second ball in the Dropping Zone; or
 - o Taking two club length relief where it is **known** to have crossed the greenside edge before going into penalty area.
- Men's Dropping Zone is located on the Yellow Tee Bed.
- Ladie's Dropping Zone is located on the left side of the ravine close to the Red Tee Bed and is clearly marked.
- NOTE: Hole 7 is a Call Up Hole If you are on the Green and the game behind you are on the Tee then mark your ball. Stand aside and let the match behind you play their tee shots.
- <u>15th Hole</u> A Dropping Zone is provided as an extra relief option (for one stroke penalty).

Lake on Hole 18 – the Red Penalty Area extends towards the chipping green. It is next to the Course Boundary. For a ball **KNOWN** to have entered the Penalty Area from the right of the lake, Penalty relief is permitted on the left side of the lake. This should be equidistant from the original point of entry.

ABNORMAL COURSE CONDITIONS

- The Ancient Kiln on Hole 1 and Olive Press on Hole 8. The respective Dropping Zone <u>must</u> be used. This includes stance.
- The grass nursery between Holes 10 & 18 surrounded by a wooden fence. Full relief MUST be taken.

Rule 16 - General Exception: No Relief When Clearly Unreasonable to Play Ball (Unreasonable stance; direction of play etc.)

NO PLAY ZONES - Players MUST NOT enter or play from any No Play Zones under <u>ANY</u> circumstances. Blue staked GUR areas with GREEN painted tops indicate No Go, No Play Zones. Do not retrieve your ball.

Free relief is permitted from the point of entry (estimated) for a ball KNOWN to have entered the area [Stance, swing, ball + one club-length].

INTEGRAL PARTS OF THE COURSE - The following are Integral Objects - free relief is not allowed:

- a. Free standing feature walls on holes 5; 11; 13 and 15.
- b. Any natural free-standing rocks.

PLAYER CONDUCT - Use of Buggies

In addition to behaviour expected of Players, there is a <u>strict</u> policy where Buggies are prohibited:

- Par 3s Buggies are not permitted on the grass and MUST remain on the Cart Path.
- Par 4s & 5s At the Yellow Cart Signs, Buggies MUST go to & remain on the Cart Paths.

TEMPORARY IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS [TIO] (F-23)

- a. Event specific TIOs, (e.g. Tents; R&A; Sponsor banners etc.) if difficult to move, free relief is available for physical interference, line of sight interference or both types of interference. A ball may be dropped within one club-length of the Nearest Point of Complete Relief.
- b. However, there are exceptions to relief. Please send for a Referee.

General Information

- Please replace divots, repair pitch marks and rake bunkers.
- Shout "Fore" for any shot offline.
- Use "Ready golf" whenever safe and possible.
- Scorecard &Fairway distance markers are in METERS to the CENTRE of the green.
- Water filling stations are available outside the Proshop, Starter's Hut, prior to 5th tee and aside 14th green.
- Medical Assistance on course Please contact ProShop26 828 216; Staff Member; Ball spotter or Referee.

PLAY SUSPENSION PROCEDURES

A suspension of play for a dangerous situation will be signalled by a prolonged note of a horn. All other suspensions will be signalled by three consecutive short notes of a horn repeated. In either case, resumption of play will be signalled by two short notes of a horn repeated.

1. Lightning

If lightning is observed approaching the course and play must be suspended, a prolonged note of a horn will sound. This may be repeated. All players and spectators <u>MUST</u> leave the course immediately. Balls in play should be marked and lifted (however, safety is more important as such location of original ball can be resolved when play resumes). When play can be resumed, players will be advised and when everyone is ready, two short notes of a horn will sound, repeated as needed.

2. Rain

If, in the opinion of the Committee or its representative on the spot, heavy rain makes the course unplayable, three consecutive short notes of a horn will sound and repeated. Players should mark and lift their balls but remain on or near the hole being played for 45 minutes. Cover should be sought if near the Halfway House/Clubhouse. When play can be resumed two short notes of a horn will sound, repeated. If, after 45 minutes, the rain has not abated, the Committee will advise players of the procedure to be followed.

3. Effect of suspension of play

If play is or becomes impossible (e.g. high wind, lightning, rain or any other reason), and play is abandoned for the day, the Committee will, in its absolute discretion, decide how this will affect the regulation of the competition and advise players accordingly.
